EXCURSIONS

For Saturday, we have an offer from a travel agency to make a guided tour to **Bran Castle** at a cost of 50 Lei (ca. 10.50 Euro); the entrance ticket to the castle (40 Lei = ca. 8.50 Euro) is not included yet. Alternatively, we can travel by public bus... only 10 - 15 Lei, but probably not as comfortable and cozy as with an extra group tour...

This agency also offers tours to <u>Poienari</u> (<u>Poenari</u>), the historical ruin high on a mountain in the Arges valley that was Vlad III Dracula's last defense against the Turks and against his brother Radu the Beautiful.

As a further travel goal, I would like to point out that <u>Târgoviste</u> is not far away from Brasov: the city where Vlad III Dracula had his centre of power during his first rule. There are interesting historical ruins around the <u>Chindia Tower</u>. I will travel to Târgoviste on Sunday morning by bus anyway, and who would like to join me is welcome.

Finally, <u>Sinaia</u> on the road to Târgoviste is interesting for its <u>Royal Palace</u>.
